Harrow Manorway improvement works

Works to widen the Harrow Manorway corridor and support other developments in south Thamesmead are progressing well.

From 15 January, for approximately 10 days, work will begin to remove the existing trees to enable better quality footpaths, segregated cycle ways, bus lanes, vehicle running lanes, and provide a central landscaped area.

The 31 existing trees will be replaced with more extensive landscaping which will be introduced along the entire Harrow Manorway route. Over 100 new trees will be planted in total in the central median and alongside the new footpaths.

Most of the trees which need to be removed are not located on public footways or the road. They will need to be fenced off whilst work is ongoing, and this may at times mean, that stop/go boards, are used to manage local traffic.

The work is the latest stage of a major highway and public realm improvements programme which London Borough of Bexley is delivering with partners, including Royal Borough of Greenwich and Peabody. It will support other developments planned for the area.

The removal of the trees will be carried out by the Council's contractor for highway works, F M Conway.
